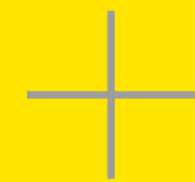

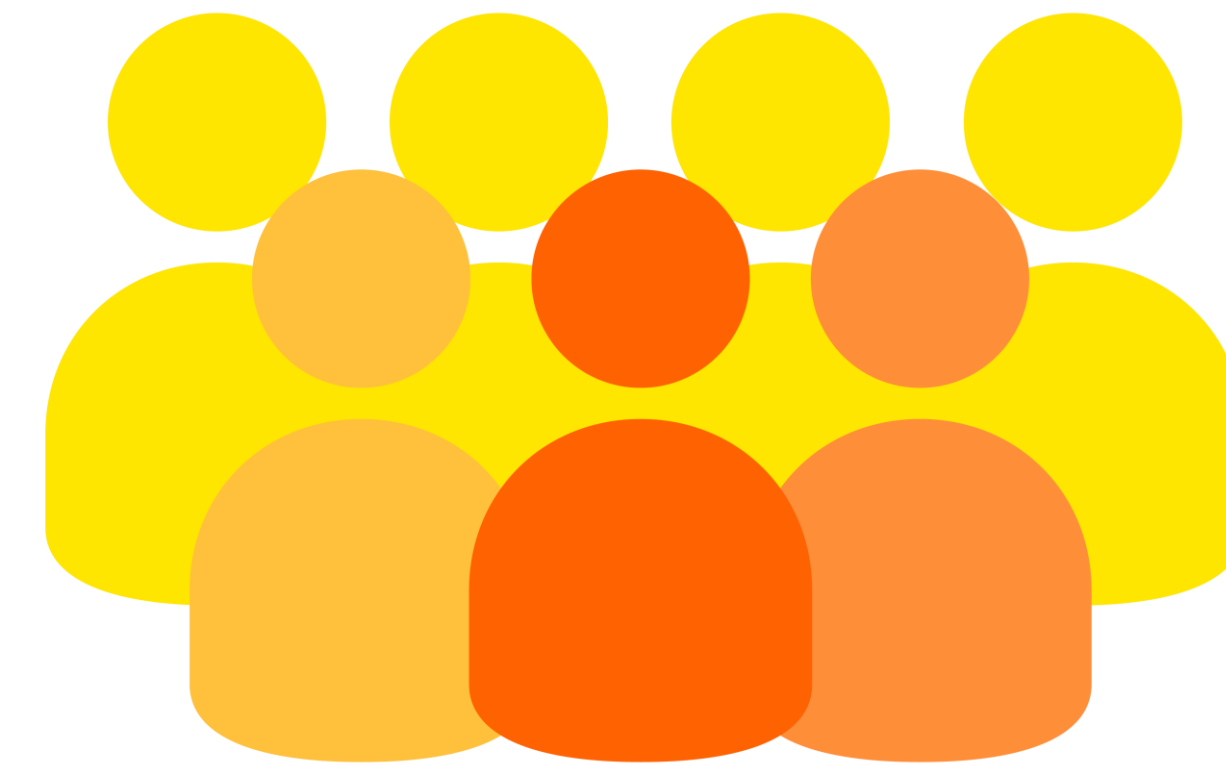


Pilotlight 360

Over 8 months, four of our most senior and experienced Pilotlighters coach a charity leader and their board through the strategic challenges they face.

Pilotlight 360 is designed to be flexible to a charity's needs, but always covers a period of information gathering, followed by collective objective setting and collaborative action to achieve those goals.

Outcomes for the charities vary depending on the project, but some of the most commonly reported include an increase in income and reach, more effective staff and boards, and improved confidence and leadership skills in the charity leader.

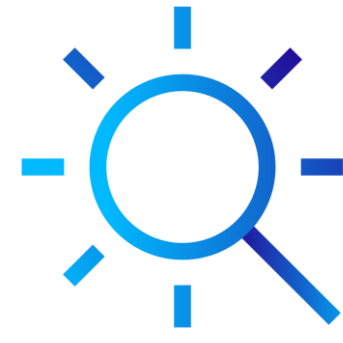

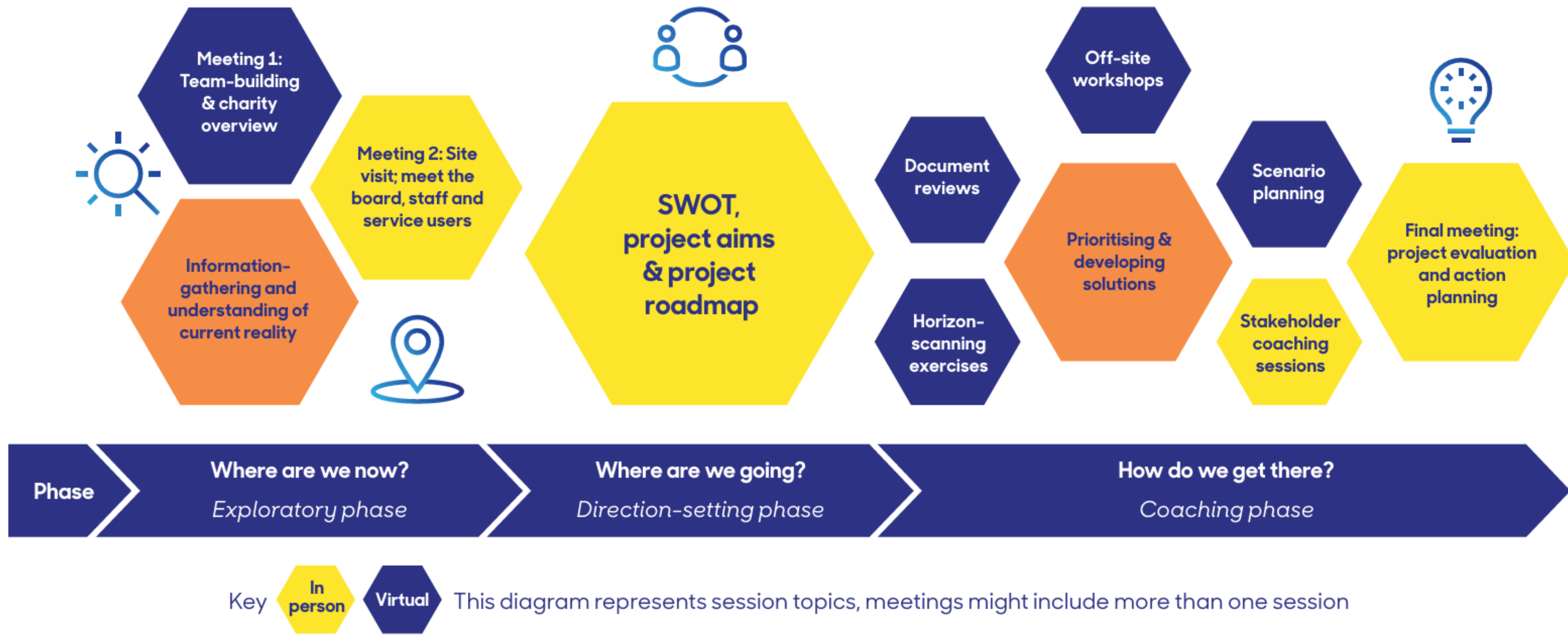

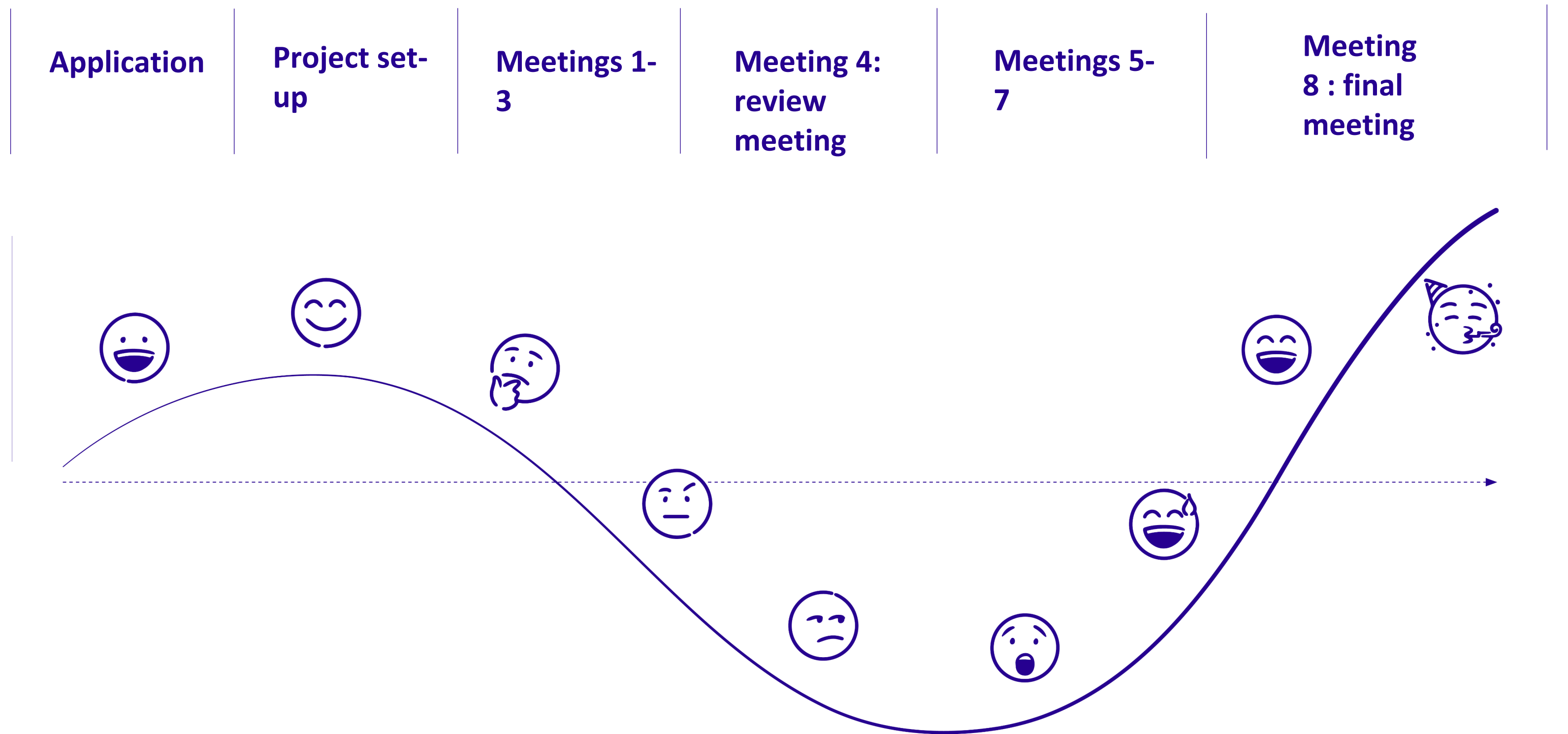
Developing your charity's **systems and processes**

Experience of change



Criteria

Eligibility

- Registered charities in the North and Midlands regions of England and Wales
- Working in the field of Community, Environment , Welfare or Youth
- Delivered services for at least two years
- Annual income of less than £5million
- At least one full-time member of staff in a paid leadership position
- Provide direct services to beneficiaries or taking practical action on the environment
- Majority of activities or beneficiaries based in North or Midlands of England, or Wales

Selection criteria

- Suitability for Pilotlight 360
 - Ability to demonstrate a degree of financial stability that enables full engagement in the programme
 - Alignment across leadership in openness to challenge and change
 - Willingness to travel to Central London for around two out of eight meetings
 - Charity leader and board engagement – one member of the board is able and willing to attend one in three meetings
- Organisational impact
- Ambition for charity
